Dear Sixth Grade Parents:

Enclosed is the summer reading list for your child. This year each incoming sixth grader is required to read either *Shiva's Fire* by Suzanne Fisher Staples or *The Conch Bearer* by Chitra Banerjee Divakaruni. (Or both, naturally, if your child is so inclined!) These novels take place in India, and will set the stage for our first history unit. I recommend that the required book be saved to the latter half of the summer for better retention. Aside from that, have your son or daughter use the attached list as a source of excellent suggestions about books that have been tested and proven among the 6<sup>th</sup> grade set. There is a separate list at the end specifically of recommendations from outgoing 6<sup>th</sup> graders to the incoming class. If there are other books, not on this list, that your child would like to read, by all means!

Here are the books your child is not to read, as they are some that I know we will be reading next year! *The Secret Garden*, *The Giver*, *A Day Nno Pigs Would Die* and *Old Man and the Sea*.

Throughout the summer, your child should always have a book "in progress." Books should go to camp, on vacation, and on visits to family, to be read at quiet times or in a spare moment. Reading can happen under the covers with a flashlight, in a sleeping bag, on a porch swing, in a hammock and in the back seat of a car. I've even seen kids read while up a tree, though reading while riding a horse or bicycle is not recommended.

Though I hesitate to set a specific number of books, because I want the children to feel comfortable reaching for long or challenging books without feeling a lot of time pressure, I will suggest a minimum of four books (including the required book). More is certainly fine, and, in fact, encouraged if feasible.

I will collect a list of books and authors on the first day of school, so have your child keep a log. There is no need to write a summary or report, just a list will suffice.

### **Required book:**

#### **Shiva's Fire by Suzanne Fisher Staples**

In this powerful novel rich with mysticism, Suzanne Fisher Staples tells the poignant story of a strong girl who refuses to squander her magical gifts in the face of life's ordinary but perplexing mysteries.

**OR**

#### **The Conch Bearer by Chitra Banerjee Divakaruni**

In India, a healer invites twelve-year-old Anand to join him on a quest to return a magical conch to its safe and rightful home, high in the Himalayan mountains. The present and the past intertwine in this tale of adventure and fantasy.

Hobbs, Will *Bearstone*

Cloyd is sent to a home for boys when all he wants is to live in the wilds of remote Utah canyons. A sequel to *Beardance*.

Hoffman, Alice *Indigo*

When Martha, Trevor and Eli run away, they uncover an amazing secret about their town and themselves!

Jacques, Brian *The Angel's Command*

It's ghost ships, shark attacks and non-stop action for Ben and his dog, Ned...the sole survivors of the *Flying Dutchman*!

Kelly, Eric P. *The Trumpeter of Krakow*

In 1461 Joseph Charnetski and his family arrive in Krakow to deliver a mysterious crystal to the king for safekeeping.

Konigsburg, E.L. *The View From Saturday*

A story about members of a sixth grade “Academic Bowl” team. It won the Newbery medal four years ago.

Langdon, Jane *The Time Bike*

Eddie is embarrassed by his funny-looking bike until he discovers it can travel through time.

Lasky, Kathryn *Mary, Queen of Scots, France 1553*

Separated from her mother and her country, young Mary is sent to France to live under the care of the ruthless Queen, Catherine de Medici.

Lowry, Lois *The Silent Boy*

When tragedy strikes his family, only Katy can unravel the secrets locked in Jacob’s mind!

Martin, Ann *A Corner of the Universe*

After Uncle Adam arrives, Hattie’s summer is anything but normal!

Montgomery, Lucy *Anne of Green Gables*

Anne Shirley, the heroine of this perennially popular series, lives on Canada’s Prince Edward Island at the turn of the century. As the series begins, she is eleven and full of troubles until she sorts out her relationship with her foster mother.

Namioka, Lensey *Yang the Youngest and his Terrible Ear*

Yingtao is an immigrant from China to the United States. Unlike the rest of his family, he does not have musical talent.

Paterson, Katherine *The Same Stuff as Stars*

Angel’s only a kid but she takes care of her little brother and frail great-grandmother! Can a mysterious stranger help?

Paulsen, Gary *Cook Camp*

During WWII , a little boy is sent to live with his grandmother, a cook in a camp for workers building a road through the wilderness.

Paulsen, Gary *Hatchet*

After a plane crash, thirteen year old Brian spends fifty-four days in the wilderness and learns how to survive.

Paulsen, Gary *The River*

Two years earlier, Brian was stranded in the wilderness for fifty-four days with nothing but a hatchet. Now the government wants him to do it again so that scientists can study his survival techniques.

Paulsen, Gary *Dogsong*

Russell seeks to find his “song” of himself in the traditional way of his Eskimo people.

Paulsen, Gary *The Time Hackers*

Dorso Clayman opens his locker to find a dead body inside. Thirty seconds later...it disappears!

Pierce, Tamora *The Will of the Empress*

Sandry has been summoned by her cousin, the Empress of Namorn, and she is shocked to discover what awaits her at the palace. Can she rely on unique powers to escape the brutal empire?

Rawlings, Marjorie Kinnan *The Yearling*

A young boy grows up to learn the hardship and pain of making an adult decision. This wonderful tale is set in the central Florida “scrub pine” country in the nineteenth century.

Rawls, Wilson *Where the Red Fern Grows*

A young boy in the Ozark Mountains during the Depression earns the money to buy and then train a fine pair of coon hounds. A fine coming of age novel with dreams and values tested and justified.

Rinaldi, Ann *A Stitch in Time*

The Chelmsford family of Salem, Massachusetts is separating in 1788 and Hannah decides to make a memory quilt to share with her sisters. The sequels are *Broken Days* and *The Blue Door*.

Rinaldi, Ann *Taking Liberty*

Oney Judge is Martha Washington’s personal servant and practically a member of the family. But she’s also a slave and she finally decides to take what is rightfully hers...her freedom!

Rylant, Cynthia *Missing May*

A twelve year old girl named Summer undertakes a journey to contact her Aunt May who has died.

Sperry, Armstrong *Call It Courage*

Mafatu is a Polynesian boy nearly drowned at sea as a young child. Now he must prove his courage as he comes of age.

Stanton, Mary *Unicorns of Balinor #1*

Princess Arianna and her unicorn have lost their magic! How can they save their kingdom?

Stevenson, Robert Louis *Treasure Island*

In this story of piracy and concealed treasure, Jim Hawkins discovers a treasure map, becomes involved with pirates and other sinister characters and has many mysterious and terrifying adventures.

Stolz, Mary *Bartholomew Fair*

On an August day in 1597 six people, including Queen Elizabeth, a wealthy cloth merchant, a scullery maid, two schoolboys and an overworked apprentice, attend London's Bartholomew Fair and come away with unforgettable experiences. This book reads a bit like a movie script and there is lots of cutting back and forth from one set of characters to another.

Stroud, Jonathan *The Bartimaeus Trilogy*

In the first book Nathaniel is a young magician with one thing on his mind...revenge!

Snyder, Zilpha Keatley *The Egypt Game*

A shared love of ancient Egypt leads to the development of the Egypt Game.

Tolkien, J.R.R. *The Hobbit*

This tale of a hobbit and his adventures is a recent classic and leads to *The Lord of the Rings Trilogy*...another good read!

Verne, Jules *20,000 Leagues Under the Sea*

This is a story of desperate men at sea who cling to a giant hulk in the water. They become drawn into Captain Nemo's incredible underwater ship and begin a fantastic journey.

Williams, Stephen *How to Be President*

You just woke up...as President! How do you find the bathroom? When do you use Air Force One?

Wells, H.G. *The War of the Worlds*

The classic invasion story about Martians landing on Earth.

Woodson, Jacqueline *Locomotion*

All Lonnie wants is to be reunited with his sister. How can poetry help make his dreams come true? Told in verse!

Wyss, Johann *Swiss Family Robinson*

This story of a shipwrecked family tells about the adventures they encounter while surviving on a tropical island.

Yolen, Jane *Dragon's Blood*

Fifteen year old Jakkin Stewart steals and trains a dragon. Sequels are *Heart's Blood* and *A Sending of Dragons*.

## NONFICTION

Adamson, Joy *Born Free*

This story of a lioness raised in a Kenya home bridges the gulf between the worlds of the jungle and that of humans. Sequels are *Living Free* and *Forever Free*.

Adler, David *B. Franklin, Printer*

Statesman, writer, scientist, inventor—meet America's most versatile founding father. Filled with historic illustrations from Franklin's life!

Davidson, Margaret *Helen Keller*

This short biography of a woman who was blind, deaf and dumb focuses on how much was still possible for her.

Davidson, Margaret *Louis Braille: The Boy Who Invented Books for the Blind*

Though blind, Louis was determined to invent a way to help himself and other blind people to get a thorough education.

Fritz, Jean *China Homecoming*

A historian who writes for children, Jean Fritz was born and raised in China. Here she remembers that world and what it was like in the mid 1920's to be "homesick" for the United States, giving a vivid picture of the life in China.

Gormley, Beatrice *First Ladies: Women Who Called the White House Home*

An interesting look at life with the women "behind the scenes" of several presidencies. The women were sometimes funny, sometimes shocking but always interesting.

Gutman, Bill *Lance Armstrong*

He won seven consecutive Tour de France cycling championships....and beat cancer. Read his story to find out how he did it.

Hamilton, Bethany *Soul Surfer*

Thirteen year old Bethany Hamilton lost her arm in a shark attack! Find out how her courage and her belief in God helped her survive and go on to compete in the National Surfing Championships!

Hampton, Wilburn *Kennedy Assassinated! The World Mourns*

This is an individual reporter's recollection of President Kennedy's assassination.

Hurwitz, Jane and Sue *Sally Ride: Shooting for the Stars*

This book follows Sally Ride's training as an astronaut.

Jerome, Leah *Dian Fossey*

Dian Fossey studied and defended African mountain gorillas and was probably killed trying to defend them.

Kerby, Mona *Amelia Earhart: Courage in the Sky*

This short biography of Amelia Earhart explores her dream of flight and the unexplained mystery of her death.

Lipsyte, Robert *Arnold Schwarzenegger: Hercules in America*

Arnold Schwarzenegger began as an immigrant to America and ended up in the movies and married to a member of a major political family.

Neyland, James *George Washington Carver: Scientist and Educator*

“The Peanut Man” is probably America’s most famous African American scientist.
